Dear Parents,

Janus Global School, CBSE has completed one successful year of providing high quality education to all students of the school and is all set to step into the second year. The school curriculum, projects, events and activities have ensured that we provide the best in class facilities to all our children to ensure 360 degree improvement in all related skills. A brief report on the infrastructure added, partnerships established, events, projects and activities undertaken during the last academic year or to be introduced next year are listed out for your perusal.

Partnerships

1. With the singular aim to help children enhance their English speaking skills the management has entered into an MOU with UNLEARN (Supported by British Council) for implementation of this program in the school campus along with regular day-to-day curriculum.
2. With the aim of enhancing mathematical and analytical skills of its students, the school has signed an MOU with Maths Buddy, for setting up a Virtual Maths Lab in the school.
3. Maths Olympiad classes will be conducted and children will be sent for exams through SilverZone during next academic year.
4. We propose to introduce Bharathanatyam and Archery classes during next academic year.

Infrastructure

The management of the school is committed to giving its students the best infrastructure in the school, at par with the best schools across the country. To this end, the school in the previous year has made a number of additions to their infrastructures which are as follows:

- The first floor of the school now houses a 500-seater auditorium, which shall house its students and parents during events, which is under construction and will be ready for use in June 2017.
- A fully covered play area for kindergarten and primary school children has been established.
- Seven ACER Laptops have been added to the computer lab. Seven more laptops will be provided for the next academic year and will be available for use by June.
- To avoid electricity fluctuations hassles and to provide students a comfortable environment in campus, a servo stabilizer has been installed for the school premises.
- CCTV cameras have been installed in all class rooms and corridors.
- A separate dining area will be provided next academic year
- Two more vans will be added to our fleet of vehicles and will be available for use by June. More vehicles will be added based on the requirement.

Olympiad

The Janus Global School is committed in training students for competing at the highest level of intellect and academics. To this end, the School in this academic year conducted Science Olympiad Classes. The classes were scheduled for the three to four days a week, including on Saturdays, occasionally. Teachers were trained to impart Olympiad-specific education to the students, so as to enable students to exhibit and grasp concepts in great clarity. As a direct result of these classes, students from various classes in the school obtained accolades in the Olympiad Examinations, 8 students secured gold, 7 silver and 7 bronze in the examinations, making the school one of the best performing schools in Kanchipuram. Four of our students were selected to write the level 2 examination and we are very happy to share with you that our children have secured rank at state level in this exam as well, making the school and their parents proud.

Robotics

During the previous academic year, students from Class 6 to 8 were trained in Basic Robotics through a number of seminar classes, where they were taught to assemble six robots. To enable the students to recall the skills they had obtained during the training seminars last year, the school this year organised for a special seminar, where students were invited to exhibit the skills they had obtained last year. The management of the school is extremely happy to say that the seminar was a grand success with a number of *students exhibiting their robotic models to the awe of the students and teachers*, which also became a major feature of the Project Day–VidyaSammelan I this year.

Student Counselling

As a management committed to nation and citizen building, the school is committed to give its students overall growth and not just academic intelligence. To this end, the school employs a Wellness teacher who regularly *counsels students at the school, teaching and imbibing in them, crucial and important values*, so that, they may have that in them, which would make them successful in whatever be their endeavor – Moral Character. Given the interest of the school in the overall well-being and safety of its students, the school took it upon itself this year to conduct a special and separate seminar to educate kids on the difference between a good touch and a bad touch. In this seminar, students from class 1 to 5 were taught to differentiate between a good touch and bad touch and to safeguard themselves when in danger.

Festivals and Functions

Given the diverse and multi-cultured students in school, all festivals are celebrated in a grand manner in school, with all students participating keenly in organizing events for the school functions. This year, Independence Day and Republic Day were celebrated in traditional attire by children in school, where they were taught and reminded of their love for India, its diverse population and its entrenched principles of patriotism and sacrifice. The National Flag was hoisted with all paying due respects after which there were performances of mass drills, aerobics, dances and songs.

This year, the school also celebrated Diwali with its students, where the children exchanged sweets with one another. As a token of respect to their parents *middle school children made beautiful decorative pots and lower class children prepared greeting cards and presented them to their parents for Diwali*.

Christmas saw 'Santa Claus' visit the School and have a gala time with the children of *KG sections and distributing sweets and gifts making them extremely happy and excited*. This was followed by an excellent skit put by the KG Children for Santa Claus about the birth of Jesus Christ. It was followed by Christmas carols, skit and dance by our children.

Pongal, being the festival of Tamils was celebrated in a traditional manner, with festive lights and colours dawning the school. Children decorated the entire school with rangoli and festoons. Several games were conducted by the school during the Pongal Celebrations including **Uriadi** which was conducted for students from class 7 to 9. *The experience of playing a traditional tamil sport turned out to be a great experience for kids*, which the school hopes they cherish for times to come.

Other festivals like Vinayagar Chathurthi, Saraswathi Pooja, etc were celebrated in school in a grand manner, with students being taught about various stories and myths about the festivals that were being celebrated.

Just for Knowledge Enrichment:

That is not education, which does not equip children to be the best they can in whatever field they choose. The management of the school believes that being educated is not about being trained in a subject but is about being trained as an individual, sufficient by himself or herself, who is learned in all walks of life. To enable students to achieve this feat, the school regularly conducts a number of programs to educate children about their opportunities in life, about different careers that they may pursue and about the various day to day things that they should know and avoid. To this end, the school has conducted a number of training including legal awareness classes, first aid classes, literary classes, Ayurveda classes, etc.

In the month of September a **Legal Awareness Class** was conducted by Mr. Avinash Krishnan Ravi, an Advocate from the Supreme Court of India, who taught students about their *rights, duties, rights and wrongs* and had an interactive session with students about various walks of life and how law affects it. The students were very keen to know of methods to curb corruption, which showed their immense moral character and their sense of idealism, which impressed everyone greatly. The Students were also informed about the opportunities that are available in the field of law and Mr. Avinash encouraged students to take up law.

In the month of October the **Inner Wheel Club of Kanchipuram** conducted a **First Aid Awareness Program** for the students, where a practicing doctor visited the school and trained the children by enacting to them, practical emergency situations and how they should react and provide first aid in these situations. The students during this program were also informed of the first aid kit available in school and how the same may be used in cases where required.

In November, we organized an Advanced Hands on DNA workshop for our children in association with **Mr. V.K. Singh of Escherichia Genomics P.Ltd, Delhi**. They taught children to identify DNA of Plants from stems and leaves and DNA of Animals from blood, saliva and others.

In January, Sankara TV fame **Dr. Ashok**, Assistant Professor Dharma Ayurveda Medical College, addressed the children on '*A Strong Immune System For Disease Prevention- The Wisdom Of Ayurveda*'. The event was open to parents and students, who enjoyed the event and found it informative and beneficial for them.

Literary Associations

The school values literary works and arts, which are the historical and modern day ready references to look at the society as a whole. Given the value of literary works to the society, the school is committed to encouraging and educating students about these works. To this end, the school has started Literary Associations for Tamil, English and Hindi in this academic year, in the month of July.

Tamil Literary Association

The last hour of the first Friday of every month is allotted towards Tamil Literary Association's activities. In this association, children regularly attend and enthusiastically participate in a number of programs to showcase their talents. These educational and cultural programs are diverse, ranging *from speech, skit, songs, dance, debate, tongue twisters, etc*, all of which seek to educate students about tamil and its rich heritage and culture.

English Literary Association

The last hour of the second Friday of every month is allotted towards English Literary Association's activities. This society is committed to provide a platform for children to showcase the skills they have acquired in the English language and to encourage them to gain a better communication skill-set. To this end, the school regularly organizes *debates, dramas, quizzes, JAM, extempore, etc*.

Hindi Literary Association

The last hour of the third Friday of every month is allotted towards Hindi Literary Association's activities. Given that Hindi is an official language in India and with the growing popularity of Hindi across India, this association seeks to provide students who are interested in learning the language, *a platform to showcase their language skills*, which they may otherwise be unable to showcase elsewhere, outside the school.



Teacher Training

Right from the beginning of the academic year, teachers have been provided with regular training in **English Speaking and Writing Skills, Rubrics, Positive thinking, Secret of Success** etc., by various CBSE schools Principals, and eminent speakers and trainers like Mr. Ramprasad Singaram, Mr. Joseph (ELTAI) and others.

Project Day- Vidya Sammelan –I

With '**Pancha Bhoothangal**' as topic for this year, the project day was held on 12th January 2017. The event, which marks as a special day in the school's calendar every year was a success like no year before. The *students exhibited the skills they had gained all over the year, by making practical models and working samples* of things they have learnt during this academic year. The parents who attended the project day **Vidya Sammelan-I** were greatly enthused about the skill-set acquired by their kids. The robotics show which was displayed on the project day extremely well received by the parents and the school wishes to make it a regular aspect of the school's project day in the years to come.
